What is MLA International Bibliography?

The MLA International Bibliography is a subject index to scholarly books and articles about language, literature, folklore, and linguistics, produced by the Modern Language Association of America.

How do I access MLA International Bibliography?

From the **library's homepage** <http://library.stkate.edu>

- Go to **Find Articles** and click on **Databases and Indexes**.
- Using the alphabetical list, **Browse databases by title**, go to **M**.
- Find the **MLA International Bibliography** link

From **KateWay**

- Go to the **Library's tab**, then **Find Articles**
- Choose **English** databases, then find **MLA Bibliography**

*Off-Campus users will need to enter their KateWay login or St. Kate's network login to access the databases. Contact the Helpdesk (651-690-6402) for assistance with these logins.

Type a word or phrase into the search box.

Click on "View Record" to see the complete record.

Click on "Find full text" to determine if St. Kate's library has direct access to the full text of the item.

In order to print or save your records from the Results page, click in the box next to the record number or mark all your records by clicking on the [Mark](#) all on page link above the search results.

Editing Your Search

Click on the "Edit Search" link at the top of the Results page or scroll down to the bottom of the page to the search box where you can modify your original search or enter new search terms. Type in the information and click the "Search" button to initiate your new search.

Printing Your Results

Mark the records you want to print, and click on the "Save, Print, Email" link. Make certain that the "Use Marked Records" button is selected, and click on the "Print Preview" button. Use your browser's print function (File → Print or use the Print icon on your toolbar). Close the window and click on the "Return to Results" link.

Search Tools (purple tab)

- **Combine Searches** - you can combine the results from two or more searches from your current search history or combine your current history with a new search. Use "and" or "or" to combine searches.
- **Command Search** - expert searchers can use the Command Search box to create searches using Boolean operators and field codes (click on "Search Tools" in the "Help & Support" link to locate these codes).
- **Thesaurus** – provides standard language or a set of terms to describe a topic.
- **Indexes** – use the drop-down box to select author, journal name, and language index or publication type.

Citing

QuikBib: You can create your own bibliography of selected records using a variety of styles such as MLA or APA. Click on "Save, Print, Email" to get started.
