

## Suggested APA Citations for *Leadership: Ethics and Leadership Anthology*

### *General APA form for articles in anthologies or edited books*

Author, A. B., & Author, C. D. (20XX). Title of the chapter in the book. In (E. F. Smith, Ed.),

*This is the title of the book itself* (pp. xx-xxx). Location: Publisher press.

Below are some general guidelines to remember about APA citation style:

- The authors in these examples wrote chapter in the book you are citing. Their work appears in other sources, but you should cite the item you have in your hand.
- Give the pages of the chapter you are citing as it appears in the book you are citing.
- The date used is that of the entire book (not that of the originally published work).
- If there is no editor, use the format: In *Leadership: Ethics and leadership ORLD 6200*
- Your list should be titled References or Works cited (centered on page), and should start a new page at the end of your text. Any appendices should follow the reference list.
- The entire list should be alphabetized and double spaced, with the second line indented.
- The **in-text citation** will consist of the first element of the reference (usually an author) and the date of the book.

For example: (White-Newman, 2008).

(Goodpaster, Nash, & de Bettignies, 2008, Appendix A).

**(Note:** If your list contains more than one reference by the same author(s), include the first word or two of the title to distinguish it. Note that on the list below, items by the same author(s) and the same date are alphabetical by the chapter title that follows the date.)

For further information and help with APA citation style:

- Go to the Library's Web site ([library.stkate.edu](http://library.stkate.edu)) and select **Research Help → Citation style guides**. This site contains links to useful sites on APA style and a handy 4-page guide you can print out.
