



### What is JSTOR?

JSTOR subject areas include the humanities, social sciences, and sciences, starting with the very first issues of the core scholarly journals, some dating as far back as the 1600s. JSTOR collections include the Arts and Sciences Collections I-VII and the Biological Sciences Collection, with subsets for ecology & botany, language & literature, and music. JSTOR's agreements with publishers often include a "moving wall," which means that the most recent years (typically 3-5 years) are not available.

### How to access JSTOR

- Click on **Find Articles** then on **Databases and Indexes**
- **Browse databases by title** and go to **J** and then click on **JSTOR**.

The default search is an Advanced Search. Use the boxes to fill in search criteria. Use the drop-down menus to narrow your search further. You do not need to fill in every box.

## Viewing Articles

Your search results will display the article title, author, citation information, and a stable URL, which you can copy, and paste into your works cited or bibliography.

To view an article, click on the title. You may also use the options to download the PDF, etc

## Printing Articles
