



What is NetLibrary?

NetLibrary is a service that lets you access eBooks, which are electronic full-text copies of published printed books. Unlike the printed books on our shelves, you can access these eBooks even when the library is closed.



What's in our NetLibrary eBook collection?

Our NetLibrary eBook collection is a combination of more than 12,500 titles purchased by the CLIC and MINITEX library consortia. It consists mostly of scholarly monographs and reference materials, as well as some free public domain titles.

How do I access NetLibrary?

First method: Through the Library's website

1. Go to the library's homepage: <http://library.stkate.edu>
2. Go to [Find Books](#) and select [E-books](#)
3. Select [Go to NetLibrary](#)

Second Method: Through CLICnet

1. Go to CLICnet: <http://clinet.clic.edu>
2. Search by keyword, author, title, subject, or other criteria.
3. You can recognize eBooks on the results screen by their location (CLIC E-Book, CSC E-books-Reference, or CSC-MPLS Ebooks-Reference) and by this symbol:



4. Please note that this method requires that you create a free NetLibrary account (see below).

Do I need a NetLibrary account?

You need a free NetLibrary account if you wish to do any of the following:

- Access eBooks through CLICnet from off campus
- Access NetLibrary from off campus without connecting through the Library's website
- Use the personalization features in NetLibrary (create your own favorites and notes)

How to Create Your Free NetLibrary Account

1. Connect to NetLibrary through the Library's website:
<http://library.stkate.edu/connect/ebooks.html>
2. Select the option at the top of the screen to Create a Free Account
3. Enter your identifying information, including username, password, name, and e-mail address. Choose a username and password that you can remember easily.
4. When you are finished, select the Create Account button.
5. In the future, if you wish, you may use the main NetLibrary address (<http://www.netlibrary.com>) even if you are located off campus. Simply login using your account when you reach the NetLibrary home page.

Finding eBooks in NetLibrary

Use **Basic Search** to search for keywords, title, author, or words in the full text. Capitalization and punctuation are not necessary

Use **Advanced Search** to formulate more complex searches and use Boolean searching. Advanced Search also allows you to limit by year of publication, publisher, format, and language.

Viewing eBooks


From the Search Results screen, select:

- **View this eBook** to see the full text
- **Show Details** to see publisher information, ISBN, and other information about the book. From this screen you can choose to View this eBook.
- **Add to Favorites** to add an eBook to your list of favorites so that you can access it quickly in the future (requires a free NetLibrary account—see above)

While viewing an eBook, a variety of useful tools are available:

- **Search:** to search for words in the content
- **Dictionary:** to look up a word in the *American Heritage Dictionary*
- **Knowledge Tools:** to look up a word in an encyclopedia, search engine, or atlas
- **Notes:** to make your own notations, which you can refer to later (requires a free NetLibrary account—see above)

Getting Help—Three methods

1. Select the Help link that appears at the top of many NetLibrary screens.
2. Select the  icon that appears next to the feature you're trying to use.
