What are eBooks?

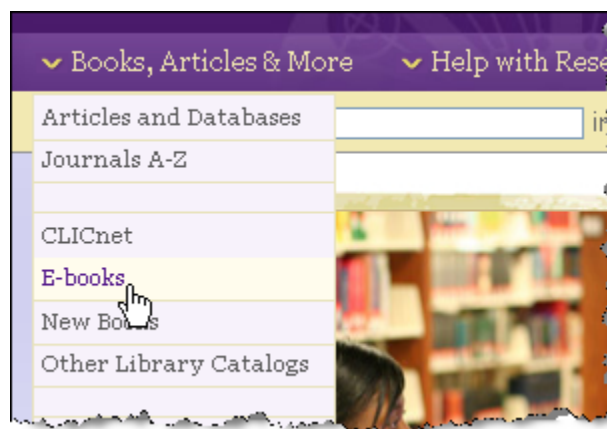
E-books are electronic versions of print books. Depending on the format, you may view them on a computer, online, or on a dedicated device. The e-books available through the St. Kate's Libraries are primarily scholarly works and must be viewed online through one of our subscription services.

How do I access E-Books?

The Libraries subscribe to e-books through various subscription services. Many reference sources such as encyclopedias are available as e-books and include full-text articles on a variety of topics. Access many of these through the e-books page.

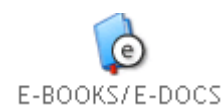

Accessing an eBook through Encore/CLICnet:

Encore/CLICnet is the library's book catalog. Books may be located on the shelves at the St. Paul (SCU Circ. Collection) or Minneapolis (SCU Mpls) libraries. They may also be available as e-books. These are identified by the e-books icon. We only have access to e-books that indicate **SCU** (St. Catherine University).

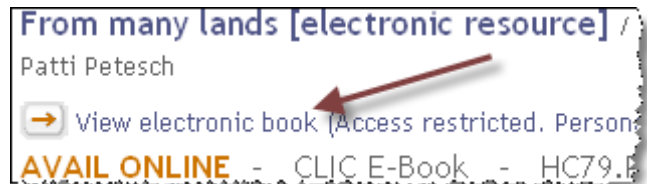

Most e-books can be accessed by clicking on the link St. Catherine access.

*From off-campus you may be prompted to enter your **KateWay login** or **library barcode** (the 14-digit number on the back of your ID).

Titles that indicate **CLIC E-Book** are available only through NetLibrary. From on campus, click the link to view.



In order to view these e-books from **off-campus**, you will need to:

- 1) **Copy the title** of the e-book from CLICnet
- 2) Go to the Library's website
- 3) Go to **Books, Articles & More** at the top of the page and select **E-books** from the drop menu.
- 4) Select **Go to NetLibrary**. From **off-campus**, you will be directed to an authentication screen. Click the button "Use My KateWay Login!"
- 5) **Search** NetLibrary by the title.

What is NetLibrary?

Our NetLibrary eBook collection is a combination of more than 12,500 titles purchased by the St. Kate's libraries, as well as the CLIC and MINITEX library consortia. It consists mostly of scholarly monographs and reference materials, as well as some free public domain titles. NetLibrary e-books are not currently available for e-book readers, but can be accessed online and read on regular computers/laptops.

How do I access eBooks through NetLibrary?

Through the Library's website <http://library.stkate.edu>

- 4) Go to **Books, Articles & More** at the top of the page and select **E-books** from the drop menu
- 5) Select **Go to NetLibrary**
- 6) From **off-campus**, you will be directed to an authentication screen. Click the button "Use My KateWay Login!"
- 7) **Search** NetLibrary by title, subject, keyword, etc.

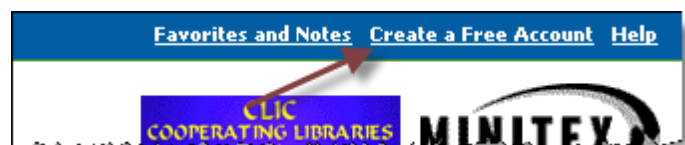
Do I need a NetLibrary account?

You need a free NetLibrary account if you wish to:

- Go to NetLibrary from off campus **without connecting** through the Library's website
- Use the personalization features in NetLibrary (create your own favorites and notes)

How to create a NetLibrary account:

1. Follow the steps listed under the "How do I access NetLibrary?" section of this guide.
2. At the very top of the page, on the right side, click on the **Create a free Account** link.
